Jahmar Hill, born in Elizabeth, New Jersey, began his career as an actor starring and appearing in several films and television shows. He later embraced the direction of becoming a filmmaker.

Jahmar wrote, Executive Produced, Directed and acted in his first indie film, "Last Love Lost". It won several awards in the film festival runs, which landed him a distribution deal with Amazon Prime.

With "Last Love Lost" under his belt, he was requested and hired to ghost write for small production companies, as well as, retained to direct film and TV.

Jahmar later decided to move to Los Angeles, CA to build connections. He was hired at Warner Brother studios then later offered a position in the Production department working on the Emmy Winning TV Show, Lucifer. Working between WB and his own projects, Jahmar managed to complete his second feature film, Fourth Quarter, which finished a small theatrical run in theaters on Dec 21, 2018. Fourth Quarter is now available on Amazon Prime.

Working at Warner Bro Studios, landed him meetings to pitch his scripts. He recently had a major meeting with HBO, which put him in talks of getting his TV series "Uphill" picked up.

In the past year, Jahmar has directed multiple film & Television projects. "Surroundings", a film Executive Produced by Rapper, Fetty Wap's record label; A tv series, "Remembering Wednesday", which is destined to get picked up by BET; And a horror feature film, "Lethal Procedures", starring Tyler Perry's, own Cocoa Brown & Hassan Johnson, from HBO "The Wire", which releases in theaters 2020.

Jahmar has been featured on various talk shows, radio shows and recently had an exclusive interview with Rolling Out magazine. His most outstanding interview was with "Fox 5 NY, Good Day Street Talk" hosted by Emmy anchor, Antwan Lewis.
